Since 2010, St. Monica has awarded academic scholarships to students in Catholic high school. Later, the scholarship was extended to middle school grades. To encourage Catholic education in all grades, the parish is now granting awards to students in Grades K-8.

- Students in Grades K-4 can request a grant of \$1000 each year.
- Students in Grades 5-8 can request a grant of \$500 each year.
- Our current high school scholars will continue to receive awards of \$1000 each year.
- No new awards will be granted to high school students. We will support students who wish to attend Catholic high school in applying for financial aid.

To request a grant, contact Barbara Higgins by July 15 at 563-7447 or higgins@alum.rpi.edu. No financial information is needed, only the name of student, the grade, and the school. This information must be provided each school year.

## Creation Corner

#### Are you experiencing climate anxiety?

Once upon a time, not too long ago, all we heard of "the weather" was just the five-minute forecast segment of the nightly news. These days, tornadoes, storms, floods, wildfires, droughts, and heat waves continually create the headlines.

No debate: climate is changing with a rapidity that is stunning and can leave us feeling overwhelmed, helpless, uncontrollably worried about the immediate and long-term impact of climate changes. Those feelings are normal and have a name: climate or eco- anxiety. Climate anxiety is felt by more than 65% of people globally and is a rising mental and physical health threat.

One way to manage your climate anxiety is to focus on small, doable steps. True, some of the most significant climate threats are in the hands of corporations with extensive reach, but when we take responsibility over what is in our control, we begin to create change in the culture that impacts them.

Over the next two months, the Creation Corner in the St. Monica bulletin will focus on a series of small action steps. Embrace your vocation to be a creation steward: take a look each week to see if there's something else you can do to take part in making a difference. You'll feel better for it.



## St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

Jesus, who is my neighbor?

Our neighborhood is blessed with multiple non-profit organizations providing needed services. One is on our campus.

On June 22, St. Monica Church was filled with families of sixty-two 8<sup>th</sup>-grade students graduating from **Rochester Academy Charter School**. Rochester Academy Charter School leases St. Monica school building at 841 Genesee St. It serves over 200 grade 6-7-8 City youth with a team of 27 teachers and staff.

RACS is a tuition-free public charter school with 2 other sites in addition to their middle school at St. Monica. It has a total of 714 K-12 students. Overall, 90% of RACS students are non-white, 6% are English-learners, 11% have disabilities,

and 3% are homeless. Still, their 4-year 12th grade graduation rate is over 94%, among the highest of all Rochester public schools.
