

Creation Corner

Let Justice and Peace Flow Season of Creation 2023



"There is a nobility in the duty to care for creation through little daily actions... all of these reflect a generous and worthy creativity which brings out the best in human being." (Excerpt from Laudato Si' 211)

Conversion is not real nor true if it does not have a direct impact on the care for our world. This impact is based on small actions that, multiplied by the constancy and conviction of many people, are capable of generating great changes.

These small actions, such as turning off an unnecessary light, separating refuse, cooking only what can reasonably be consumed, avoiding the use of plastic, showing care for other living beings, using public transport or car-pooling, planting trees, or any number of other practices, are not very difficult to carry out.

It is enough to start with one of them; then, the force of habit will make us acquire the practice and these actions will be carried out naturally and will increase in number, intensity and effectiveness.

A Way to Support Parish Environmental Efforts at Home

Our successful planting of tall sunflowers at the St. Monica gardens serves environmental needs and has drawn general interest. Bees gather pollen from the sunflower heads and birds, including goldfinches, love the ripened seeds. Several photographers have dropped by spontaneously and taken pictures.

Now it's time for the next productive phase. We need helpers to pick out by hand the fully-ripe seeds for both bird feeding and assembling seeds for next year's expanded garden. Please consider taking home a sunflower head and removing the seeds to be returned to the St. Monica narthex in a provided zip-loc bag. It's a great activity to do while watching TV, before bedtime, or sitting at the kitchen table. The gathered seeds will be used in bird feeders, and some will be planted in the neighborhood next year. Get some seeds for your own garden. Contact John Curran at weekend church services if you're interested.

St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

Jesus, who is my neighbor?

The 2021 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year survey from the US Census Bureau offers us a numerical picture of St. Monica's neighborhood.

St. Monica Church sits on the boundary of 14619 and 14611. Altogether, 32,681 people live in 14619 and 14611.



In terms of ethnicity and race the residents identify as:

61% Black/African-American

12% Hispanic

21% White

6% others.

There are 12,782 households, with an average of 2.5 persons per household. About 4,000 are female heads of household, and 5,300 are "non-family" households.

Median household income differs widely in the two zip codes. In 14619 it is a modest \$56,000, although 20% of families live below the poverty line.

In 14611 it is only \$29,000, and 31% of families live below the poverty line. 25% of households have no vehicle.

Neighborhood challenges truly await the light of Christ's presence.
