Creation Corner

Laudate Deum (Praise God) Discussion and Reflection Scheduled

It has been eight years since Pope Francis published his encyclical *Laudato Si*,' where he initially shared his faith-inspired thoughts on the problems associated with human-caused climate change. In his recent apostolic exhortation *Laudate Deum*, Pope Francis acknowledges that societies are not moving fast enough to effectively implement actions that are needed to slow and eventually halt the damage that is being done to our world.

In recent weeks, we have seen some promising steps taken by world leaders at the latest climate summit, COP28, held in Dubai. At these talks, world leaders finally committed to transition away from all fossil fuels. This will take great human effort, but it is a critical step in making progress to effectively address climate change.

A particular reflection in *Laudate Deum* that impressed me was the following: "Efforts by households to reduce pollution and waste, and to consume with prudence, are creating a new culture... let us realize, then, that even though this does not immediately produce a notable effect from the quantitative standpoint, we are helping to bring about large processes of transformation rising from deep within society."

It is given that large cooperative political and socioeconomic efforts at the levels of world governments, cultures, and societies are definitely needed to address the most pressing requirements to alleviate global warming. However, individual efforts that we as Christians can perform in our daily lives are also important transformative influences that can impress political and business leaders to take action.

What "urgent actions" can we take as enlightened Catholics to either directly or indirectly affect the work needed to care for our environment?

You are cordially invited to learn more about Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation to "Praise God" in the care of His Creation. There will be a gathering after the 4 PM Mass on Saturday January 20 to share thoughts and questions raised in reading *Laudate Deum*. We will also reflect on what actions

we can take as individuals and as a community to help create a sustainable world for ourselves and future generations. Please join us then.
