Beware of Scams

Several parishioners have contacted the office lately saying that they have received a text or email from someone claiming to be "Fr. Ray" and asking for money or gift cards. Please remember that this is a SCAM. No matter what the message says, remember that Fr. Ray will never reach out personally to you to ask for money or gift cards. The ways that Fr. Ray would ask for money are in an announcement to the whole church or via official letter (particularly in the case of the Catholic Ministries Appeal). DO NOT give money to someone asking through text or email - these scammers usually ask for a "favor." You can be certain that someone contacting you in this way is NOT Fr. Ray. Block the contact. If you are unsure, you can always call the office to ask.

St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

Jesus, who is my neighbor?

Rochester Fire Department is not really a business, but they provide an important community service!

Rochester Fire Department's "Engine 7" Firehouse at 873 Genesee St. has served since 1925. Firefighters staff the station 24x7, ready to respond to neighborhood fires, accidents, rescues, HAZMAT, and medical emergencies.





Over the decades, many RFD firefighters came from St. Monica parish families, such as Bunce, Higgins, Mulcahy and Whitehair. Capt. Kevin Ryan and Lt. Tzar Parson currently command Engine 7.

During times between calls, Engine 7 firefighters may visit schools, community meetings, and festivals to promote fire prevention. They offer free smoke alarms for qualified residents who call 428-1360.
