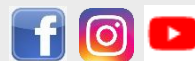

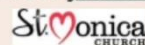

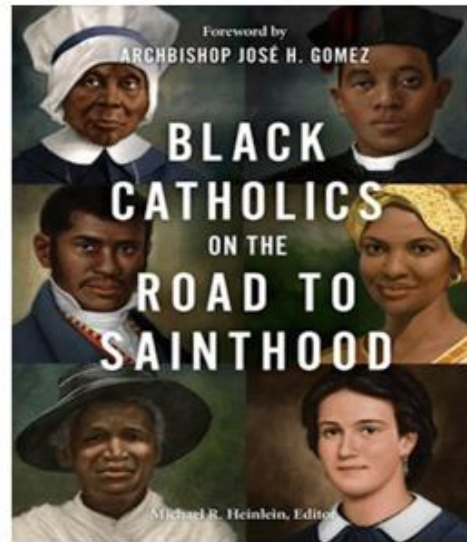

Creation Corner

In last week's column, we wrote about eco-anxiety as being heightened emotional, mental or physical distress in response to dangerous changes in the climate. This week we explore how parents can help their children deal with eco-anxiety.

On the UNICEF website, psychotherapist Carolyn Hickman wrote that "children and young people are affected more than adults. They are still developing physically and emotionally. They are also impacted more because climate change is affecting their whole future — studying, school and future careers. They are dependent on adults, as they often have limited economic and political power to directly influence action on climate change."

Hickman stated that the most important thing a parent can do is talk with their children, ask them how they feel and what they think, and validate their experiences, even if the parent doesn't fully share it. Parents should teach their children how to be okay in a world that does not feel okay by saying, "You do not have to be happy about what is happening, but you need to find meaning and focus on what we still have in this world. Take care of it, value it, love and appreciate it."

The Creation Stewards at St. Monica's recommend that people consider reading key Bible passages and thinking or talking about how they may be reassuring. Parents could also do this with their children. Here are a few:

Matthew 11:28: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

1 Peter 5:7: "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you."

Psalms 37:5: "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will act."

John 14:27: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled; neither let them be afraid."

Social Justice News

The tragic death of Renee Good in Minnesota and the ensuing debate over where the fault lies have led Catholics to consider how they can take a stand for social justice in our country. Our vice president laid the blame for the death on the woman herself and the "radicals who teach people that immigration is the one type of law that rioters are allowed to interfere with." This would hardly be considered a Christian viewpoint much less a Catholic one, since we believe that ALL humans are made in God's image and have inherent dignity even while protesting unjust government policies and practices. Such protesting should not carry with it a death sentence.

What We Can Do:

Immigration/deportation efforts are spiraling out of control. Calls to our NYS elected officials are even more critical to help protect our communities as best we possibly can.

On Monday, January 12, people from across the State lobbied in Albany on these issues. We can amplify their message by doing the following:

Call Gov. Hochul, your State Senator and Assembly Member, and leaders Andrea Stewart-Cousins and Carl Heastie and say: "I want you to take IMMEDIATE action in January 2026 to pass NY4All, the MELT Act, and other legislation to protect our immigrant neighbors and all of us from illegal immigration activities."
