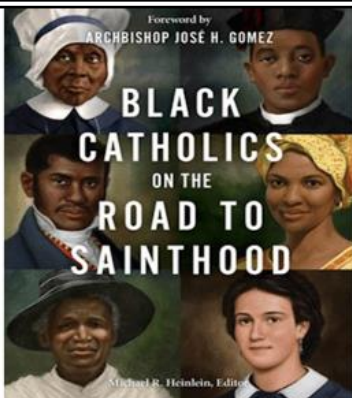

About the Scholarship Ministry by Barbara Higgins
Catholic education challenges students to strive for excellence, to make choices based on the Gospels, to honor diversity, and to serve others. To encourage families to enroll a child in Catholic school, our parish grants awards to registered parishioners:

o \$1000 each year to students in Grades K - 4

o \$500 each year to students in Grades 5 - 8

The scholarship fund is a separate investment fund overseen by the St. Monica Finance Committee. Over 40 students have received scholarships since 2006. The scholarship has changed over the years — originally, it was dedicated to Catholic high school students, but now scholarships encourage enrollment of our youngest parishioners. There is no financial requirement or limit. I chose to work in this ministry because I am a grateful graduate of Catholic education from Grade 1 through college. I observed the sacrifices of not only parents, but teachers and elders who valued the experience of Catholic education. Going forward, I would like to encourage familiarity with events at our Catholic schools. Schools have concerts, plays, and sporting events that are both entertaining and encouraging for students. For all students, regardless of where they are enrolled, I'd like to have a September and/or June Mass to celebrate the school year.

Creation Corner

The legislative season has begun for New York State but yet, there is only one act concerning the environment pending in the legislature. Last year, the full Senate and all the Assembly committees passed the **Packaging Reduction, Recycling and Infrastructure Act**, but the act wasn't brought for a vote by the whole Assembly. The act will not have to go through all the committees again and the act's sponsors (there are many) will be pushing for passage.

In addition, in her State of the State address, the Governor has included several items designed to help the environment and to deal with climate change. These include:

- Continued investment in the **Environmental Protection Fund** to safeguard our water, farmland and forests.
- Increased commitment to **Clean Water Projects** which will replace lead service lines.
- Mitigating **flood risks**, investing in **Coastal Resiliency Plans** and **Waterfront Revitalization Plans**.
- **NY State Parks Trade Corps**: This is a pilot which will provide participants experience and paid training in high demand trades while restoring parks and recreation areas.

We will be following all these bills and proposals throughout the budget and legislative processes.
