




#### St. Monica Roman Catholic Church of Rochester Vision and Mission



**Rochester Greenovation** is a used-goods store whose mission is to keep things out of landfills and create a place where people can buy things they need at reasonable prices. It has a huge collection of furniture, clothes, tools, dishes, pots & pans, unique finds, crafts, toys, gear, costumes, antiques, building materials and LOTS more.

Rochester Greenovation is a nonprofit formed in 2011 that is 100% run by volunteers. In addition to selling to the public, it also shares donations with other Rochester nonprofits.

#### **Hygiene Products for Refugees**

- 5. Menstrual pads.
