



# Creation Corner

One of the blessings of summer is hearing all the birds singing and seeing them hop around our backyards or swooping down onto our lakes.

Perhaps you consider yourself a birdwatcher, and, if so, you are not alone. Nearly 100 million Americans are birdwatchers, according to the State of Birds Report 2025. Whether you are a novice or experienced when it comes to identifying and learning about birds, here are two helpful apps that are free from the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Try them out with your kids or grandkids to inspire an interest in nature.

Merlin Bird ID: The Sound ID feature listens to the birds around you and gives you real-time suggestions for who's singing. Snap a photo of a bird or pull one from your camera roll, and Photo ID will offer a short list of possible matches. With Bird ID Wizard, you answer three simple questions about the bird you are trying to identify, and Merlin will give you a list of possible matches. You can build a digital scrapbook on the app with the Save My Bird feature.

eBird: Birders use this app to enter when, where, and how they went birding, and then fill out a checklist of all the birds seen and heard during the outing. The sightings become part of the shared global effort to map bird ranges. eBird's free mobile app allows offline data collection anywhere in the world, and the website provides many ways to explore and summarize your data and other observations from the global eBird community. The billions of bird sightings reported provide the data that powers the Merlin Bird ID.

Both apps have detailed web sites with instructions and videos to help maximize your usage. Go to ebird.org/home merlin.allaboutbirds.org.

Blue Bag collection for July will be to support SWEM: South West Ecumenical Ministries, a network of food cupboards and community agencies covering 11 zip codes in the Southwest quadrant of Rochester. Bags will be passed out on the weekend of July 12th and 13th to be returned on the 19th and 20th. Please continue to reflect the outstanding generosity that you have in the past - as you are able. The needs are:

-instant and perked coffee (not K-cups, please)

-pudding and Jell-o, regular and sugar-free

-whole wheat pasta -oatmeal, old fashioned and quick oats

-low-sodium canned vegetables -soups, low-sodium and carbs

-canned fruit

-brown rice and quinoa

-sugar-free cereal

If anyone encounters ICE officials and feels threatened, there is an emergency response number to call: 585-420-6471. That is the number of the local Rochester Rapid Response Network. As the name implies, it is very timely.

### St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

*Jesus.* who is my neighbor?

St. Monica neighborhood's small businesses bring vitality, food choices, retail options, and jobs to our neighborhood. Their survival depends on many factors, especially community support. Sadly, a few do not survive. Here are some that closed in the past year for a variety of reasons.

- o D&L Groceries closed when surviving partner Delores Hamilton retired.
- o Campi's Restaurant closed after owner Mike Pegios passed on in May, leaving no successor. It's for sale.
- o B-Healthy Fresh Food Market on Genesee and Supreme Salad Bar on Thurston closed for unknown reasons.
- o Pizza Krunch on West Main and Bob's Birdland on Chili Avenue closed only a few months after their grand openings.

Small business operation is very challenging. Most compete with highly-advertised chains, big-box stores and online shopping.

Rent, RG&E, taxes, suppliers and employees must all be paid. Reliable workers are hard to find and retain.
