March for Women's Ordination

"Members of the Roman Catholic Church are preparing for a synod that will begin in Rome on Monday and last the entire month of October.

"And we want to say to Rome, 'Rome, the women are ready," Sister of St. Joseph Joan Sobala said.

It is why women in Rochester gathered on Saturday, September 30 to walk together in their faith and spread a message.

"In particular we're interested in women's roles in the church," Sobala said. "[This includes] liturgical leadership, in leadership with other kinds of dimensions, for example, decision making."



People marched from St. Monica's Church to Susan B. Anthony Square Park to share their vision for the future.

"[We believe] that women and men can both stand at the altar to celebrate

Eucharist," Sobala said. "That women and men should be involved in decision making that would affect the whole church and not decision making that's left solely in the hands of men."

And they are not the only ones working to spread the message."

Creation Corner

HOW TO STOP YOUR JUNK MAIL

Is your mailbox choked with junk mail? According to Michael Coren, writer of the "Climate Coach" column for the *Washington Post*, there are some ways it can be reduced to a trickle.

Stop Most Advertisements

<u>DMAchoice.org</u> lets you stop delivery of catalogues, magazine offers and other junk items from charities, banks, and national brands. DMAchoice says they can stop 80% of promotional offers as marketers would rather send material to people willing to receive it.

There is a fee for this service. For \$4, deliveries will be stopped for 10 years. By mail, you can have it stopped permanently for \$5. There are options to stop mail for deceased people and even for electronic spam.

Stop Credit Card and Insurance Offers

In 1996, the Fair Credit Reporting Act led to the creation of OptOutPrescreen.com. Either using the website or calling 888-567-8688 will allow you to opt out of receiving credit card and insurance solicitations. To opt out of these mailings permanently, you will need to fill out the Permanent Opt Out Election form. The process takes a few weeks to complete.

Stop Mail from Specific Businesses

<u>CatalogChoice.org</u> is a nonprofit that allows you to opt out of mailings from specific companies. The organization has a list of 10,000 businesses and charities. You search the pre-populated list and click the mouse to send a request. This service is free.

PaperKarma is a smartphone app with a fee of \$3.99 per month or \$24.99 per year. You take a picture of the mailed item, and the algorithms try to identify it based on the logo or brand name on the envelope. Then you can instantly send an opt out request via the app.

Not all junk mail will be stopped. Grocery fliers, coupons addressed to "Current Resident" and campaign materials from political candidates (protected by the First Amendment) are not block-able.
