

Panhandling in Our Neighborhood

If you have been to St. Monica's, you have likely encountered someone in the church or parking lot asking for money. Parishioners have been asked to refrain from giving out money for several reasons, including:

- Giving money is not a sustainable ministry that St. Monica's can offer. There are other organizations that are set up to help people in the ways that they need.
- We do not want to encourage repeated visits to ask for money or word getting around that "St. Monica's gives out money."
- We have multiple programs for youth and vulnerable adults that operate in our spaces, and any present adults require *Creating a Safe Environment* training.
- We know the situations of several of the people who ask for money, and they are connected with organizations that can help them.

We **DO** want to maintain human dignity in our interactions with others. If someone asks for money, please:

- 1. Respond with kindness while maintaining the boundary: "I'm sorry, but we don't give out money here"
- 2. You may invite them to stay for Mass or coffee hour if applicable.
- 3. Inform a staff member so we can reinforce the boundary with individuals that we do not ask for or give money out in church, and so we can connect them with appropriate services, if applicable.
