Time to Re-create Advent

The word *holiday* evolved from *holy day*, which was originally a religious day when people were exempt from labor to rest and recreate. Today we're fast forwarding into what we call "the holidays" and catapulting toward *Christmas time*. All around, our commercial culture makes it known there's so much to get and do. In place of a time of rest and relaxation, too often we deal with weeks of stress, hectic activity, and overloaded demands. Rather than fighting this surging secular tide, why don't we introduce a twist? Let's use these early November days to initiate a process of experiencing the holy within a busy, chaotic life by calling on a few well-qualified spiritual helpers:

- Locusts and honey notwithstanding, if ever there was a person dedicated to preparing the way for Jesus it was John the Baptist.
- Certainly St. Joseph the Worker knew how to balance contemplation and action.
- The desert fathers and mothers initiated a strong counterculture presence as an alternative to the Roman empire and its economy.
- The mystery of the incarnation is at the heart of the spirituality of Francis of Assisi, integrating divine presence into everyday human experience.
- St. Therese of the Child Jesus earned the title Doctor of the Church based on her teaching of what she called the Little Way - stressing the importance of doing ordinary things with love.
- And what a stressful, arduous, intensely wearying trip the heavily pregnant young Mary had to undertake to get to Bethlehem to fulfill the obligation imposed on her and Joseph.

As we head into the holiday season, this column will feature suggestions to help abate the hectic and prepare to savor Advent. Let's start with incorporating this short litany into our daily prayers:

Lord Jesus,

Send your Holy Spirit upon our preparations for Christmas.

St. John the Baptist, pray for us.

St. Joseph, pray for us.

Desert fathers and mothers, pray for us.

St. Francis of Assisi, pray for us.

St. Therese, pray for us.

Holy Mary Mother of God, pray for us.

Catholic Witness: On November 13th, there will be a Catholic witness in support of our refugee brothers and sisters. This is a nationwide effort to call attention to the plight of immigrants in general and refugees in particular. In next week's bulletin, we will provide specific details as to time and place. Dilexi Te (I Have Loved You): From Pope Leo's recent exhortation comes this quote: "In a world where the poor are increasingly numerous, we paradoxically see the growth of a wealthy elite, living in a bubble of comfort and luxury, almost in another world compared to ordinary people. This means that a culture still persists - sometimes well disguised - that discards others without even realizing it and tolerates with indifference that millions of people die of hunger or survive in conditions unfit for human beings. A few years ago, the photo of a lifeless child lying on a Mediterranean beach caused an uproar; unfortunately, apart from some momentary outcry, similar events are becoming increasingly irrelevant and seen as marginal news items."

Mayonnaise or Blankets: Our blue bag collection for November will be for mayonnaise or blankets, an unlikely duo for sure. We are awaiting word from St Peter's Kitchen as to the great need at present. The need for blankets is obvious but mayonnaise? Think of how many uses we have for this staple. Tuna sandwiches, egg salad, salad dressings etc. Without mayo, these staples are tough to make. Watch here next week for the final decision!!

Jesus, who is my neighbor?

Foodlink is a large Rochester-based nonprofit emergency food system hub addressing food insecurity across a 10-county area. Foodlink acquires, stores, and distributes food through a network of community partners. St. Peter's Kitchen and SWEM are among the scores of such partners supplied by Foodlink.

Additionally, **Foodlink's Curbside Market** vehicles bring local produce and food products weekly to 52 underserved sites in Monroe County, stopping for 45 minutes each. The stops closest to St. Monica are:

- Danforth Towers, Tuesdays, 3:30pm
- Thurston Road YMCA, Wednesdays, 10:30am
