



Why Do Catholics Have Liturgical Colors?

"Liturgical colors are not selected arbitrarily, but instead signal specific meanings for certain seasons and occasions, according to Father Michael Witczak, associate professor of liturgical studies at Catholic University of America. He noted that the designation of liturgical colors goes back many centuries in Catholic Church history.

"The colors seemed to emerge out of people's reflection on the meaning of the season," said Father Witczak, who also is past president of the North American Academy of Liturgy."

Creation Corner

So, lawn mowing is a drag. Don't like watering? Would like something more interesting than a green rug in the yard? Join us on Monday, April 22, 2024 at 6:30 PM for *Beautiful and Better: Rethinking the American Lawn*. John Nelson, a master gardener, will present a workshop on how to have a more beautiful, healthier, and more attractive environment in our yards. He will tell us how to start a low maintenance flower garden with plants native to western New York. These plants grow easily and attract the all-important pollinators. He will include suggestions for sunny or shady areas, large or small yards, even flower boxes or pots. The evening promises to be fun and full of useful information. Please join in.

THE **PACKAGING REDUCTION** AND RECYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE ACT: The rates of reduction in both the amount of packaging and the amount that must be recycled/reused are phased in. Packaging is reduced 10% by weight every two to three years while the recycle/reuse percentage remains at 35% from year 3 through year 10 when it goes to 50%. These don't sound so impressive until you start applying them to the numbers. A hypothetical 200 pounds of packaging material is reduced to 180 lbs at 3 years; 142 lbs at 5 years; 96 lbs at 8 years and 59 lbs. at 10 years. At the third year, 117 lbs goes to a landfill; at year 5 the amount is 93 lbs; at year 8, it's 64 lbs and by year 10, it is down to 30 lbs to the landfill. Both rates reach 50% by year 12 and 75% by 2050.

By the beginning of the third year after promulgation of the Act, all of the named toxic substances (more than 15) are prohibited from being contained in any package sold or distributed in New York State. Most of these toxins are petrochemicals which have been found to cause multiple diseases. Current federal law does not regulate most of these chemicals are and some are even allowed to be in contact with food. Experts, however, say that there is no safe level of exposure to these chemicals. The bill remains in the Senate Finance Committee.
