



- 4. Deodorant (stick or roll-on)
- 5. Menstrual pads.

Last weekend, Don Cudzilo invited us all to meet after the 4PM Mass on January 20 to discuss and share thoughts about Pope Francis' Laudate Deum-Praise God - letter. The

## St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

Non-profit businesses serve our neighborhood with goods and services, and also provide residents with jobs.



The Salvation Army Thrift Store at 745 West Ave. is a huge 11,000 square foot shopping opportunity for budget-minded families. The store has clothing, footwear, housewares, books, furniture, appliances, music, video, toys and more. There is also a donation center where neighbors can

drop off gently-used articles.

Proceeds from the store sales fund the adjacent Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center, where those struggling

with drugs and alcohol find help, hope, and a second chance at life.

The Salvation Army Thrift Store is open Monday to Saturday from 10 am to 5 pm.



## THANK YOU, ST. MONICA

On December 15<sup>th</sup>, St. Peter's kitchen gave 300 blankets as gifts to their guests and, of those 300, St. Monica contributed 86 blankets. Check out these very happy recipient photos.





In addition, on December 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, and 18<sup>th</sup>, SWEM gave away 250 Christmas baskets over the 3-day weekend at their Gates location and at St. Monica's parking lot. And St. Monica donated 55 of those baskets. Then, on the 17<sup>th</sup>, 59 registered families received baskets (some receiving two baskets depending on the size of the family) and approximately 25 non-registered/walk-in families at St. Monica's. Those 25 families from our neighborhood who were not registered would not have had a Christmas dinner if we had not been able to provide our parking lot for the give-away to serve those walk-ins. So... approximately a total of 84 families were served at St. Monica's parking lot on the 17<sup>th</sup>.
