



Creation Corner

Last weekend, the people of St. Monica joined a very old tradition of repurposing clothing. In times past, and some of those times weren't so long ago, it was normal to pass along clothing. A garment would be passed on to as many people as possible until it could not be used for clothing anymore. And even then, the cloth served other purposes. My sister and I, and I'll bet many of you, had rag rugs next to our beds when we were young. My grandmother made those rugs, and believe me, you haven't lived until you finally get your driver's license and can take your grandmother to the rummage sale for her to haggle with the saleslady over the price of a wool coat or skirt. The price may have started at 25 cents, but the negotiation was part of the enjoyment for the ladies. That material was cut, sewn, and braided into rugs that would last more than 40 years in my mother's house.

One of the main objectives of our clothing giveaway was to prevent the cloth from ending up in landfills. It can take up to 200 years for the cloth to decompose. So, anything we can do to avoid that ending is all to the good. We are probably not going to return to making rugs, but we can find other uses for old clothing. I can't believe I ever used paper towels to clean windows now that I've found how much better - knit cotton fabric does the job. And for heaven's sake, don't buy cleaning or polishing cloths.

Thank you all for your efforts in this project. So many of you donated clothing (we didn't count how many items, but there were lots!) and sorted, hung, folded, and distributed the clothes. Most of the clothing was given away, but anything that was left over is still being used. It was donated to Blessed Sacrament Parish for their New-to-New sale on May 4-6, on the corner of Monroe and Oxford. More info:
