Creation Corner

At this point in our history, there's no doubt that we have become a throwaway culture. We are constantly pressured to get the newer, better item, whether or not we need or want it. Oh, and we can get a second one for an additional fee and get free shipping.

Now, in the face of climate change, people are re-evaluating these messages. We are learning that the earth's resources are finite and not to be wasted. In our century, the three Rs have become Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. Recycling has become pretty well-embedded in our daily lives. And we are beginning to look at whether we need to purchase new stuff. But we're not hearing so much about reusing things.

Recently, we had a clothing giveaway, which is a great way to reuse clothing we aren't using anymore.
