 Panhandling in Our Neighborhood If you have been to St. Monica's, you have likely encountered someone in the church or parking lot asking for money. We do not want to encourage repeated visits to ask for money or word getting around that "St. Monica's gives out money." We have multiple programs for youth and vulnerable adults that operate in our spaces, and any present adults require <i>Creating a Safe Environment</i> training.
