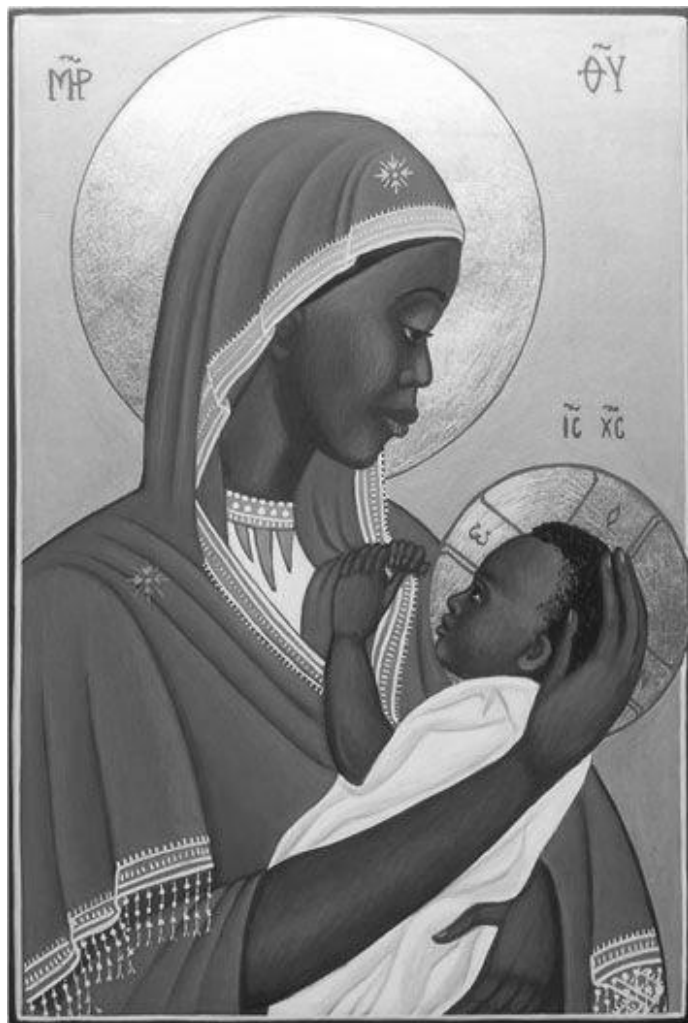

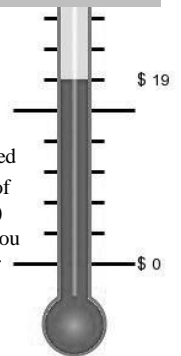

## SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER

### RACISM IN OUR WORLD

Our thanks go out to Lentory Johnson and Kerry Coleman for their sharing this past week on the work of United Christian Leadership Ministry. Century is the mother of one of the young men who died as a result of gun violence at the B&G Club and Kerry is a combat veteran and victim of our justice system. Both spoke eloquently and passionately about their experiences and the need for change. Thanks also to all who made the event possible in many ways.

The Church of the Assumption in Fairport continues a 6-week series on racism by bringing in engaging speakers who will speak about different aspects of racism in our society in relation to the pastoral letter, *Open Wide Our Hearts*. Of special note is St Monica's own Frank Staropoli on November the 6th. The speakers and dates are:

**Oct. 9th Shane Wiegand** Topic: History of Segregation and Racism Policy in Rochester

**Oct. 16th Gaynelle Wethers** Topic: "*Open Wide our Hearts* -- A Personal Testimony for Change and a Call to Action"

**Oct. 23rd Judy Toyer** Topic: "Dialogue and Encounter to Change Our Hearts"

**Oct. 30th Judy Toyer** Topic: "Dialogue and Encounter for Hope, Healing, and Encounter"

**Nov. 6th Frank Staropoli** Topic: "Experiences of a White Guy in Rochester" (Our one and only Frank!!!!)

### Children's Interfaith Weekend: Oct. 18 - 20

Every year faith groups across the country focus on special needs of children. In Rochester we join with the Children's Agenda to sign letters and petitions asking Monroe County to increase subsidies to provide for special needs of children. This year's campaign will focus on the need for Early Intervention Programs for children with special needs (birth-2) and Pre-School Special Education Programs for children ages 3-5.

Approximately 5,000 children in Monroe County benefit from these programs but they often wait for services in speech, physical and occupational therapy, special services for blind and deaf children because of low service reimbursement rates. ### REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT

According to the State Dept. the number of refugees to be admitted next year will be only 18,000, a dramatic decrease in the number from previous years that marks a historic low. This is part of a larger number of combined refugee and asylum claims expected for the next fiscal year. Senior administration officials said the report submitted to Congress allocates admissions by "group of special humanitarian interests to the United States," instead of by region -- including Iraqis who assisted the United States, those who have suffered or feared religious persecution, and nationals of Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador.
