- 12:00-2:00 pm: Catered buffet lunch at Seabreeze (vegetarian and vegan options available)



Creation Corner

What is happening to our common home?

In chapter one of the encyclical Laudato Si', Pope Francis reviews the latest scientific research regarding the specifics of how we are damaging our planet. This damage includes the effects of global warming, pollution, decreasing water resources, loss of biodiversity, decline in the quality of human life, and resource inequality. He notes how we are in an unprecedented period of human history defined by "rapidification" - accelerated changes affecting humanity and the planet coupled with an intensified pace of life and work. The rapid pace of technological progress is not always geared to the common good. Human activities must be balanced with an increasing awareness, sensitivity, and concern for real environmental and societal issues. We must alter our mindsets from the "throwaway culture" and convert to models of resource preservation and renewal, moderate consumption, reuse, and recycling. A true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; in our approach to environmental debates, we must "hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." Finally, Pope Francis reminds us that "we are called to be instruments of God our Father, so that our planet might be what he desired when he created it and correspond with his plan for peace, beauty and fullness."
