Creation Corner

Strategies for Creating Your Holy Advent

Holiness is about being in union with God's purposes, not about reaching perfection. The goal is not to wait for life to calm down, but to actively seek the sacred in the middle of the everyday chaos.

Plan ahead.

- Prioritize what matters. Examine your "to do" list.
- Budget your time, energy, and money realistically.
- It's normal to feel sad, lonely, or tired during the holidays. Allow yourself to feel these emotions without judgment.
- Dedicate a quiet time for prayer, even if it's just a few minutes at a time.
- Post reminder notes to "savor the season."

Incorporate Holiness into your holiday activities.

Wrapping Gifts: How has the person who this gift is for been a sacred gift to you? Write a blessing inside the wrapping paper.

Christmas Music: Before "Grandma Got Run Over by a Reindeer," there was "O Holy Night". Make a playlist of Christmas hymns to listen to while you're baking, cleaning, or decorating. Remember, "she who sings prays twice."

Christmas Lights: Enjoy their beauty and whisper this affirmation: "The Lord is my light and my salvation."

Charlie Brown, Rudolph, Cindy Lou Who and other favorites: Jesus was a captivating storyteller. Watch these with your kids; imagine them as parables Jesus might have told the little children. Invite them to share their take-away.

Shopping: Think of the all the strangers you'll be interacting with this December (store clerks, other shoppers, drivers...) who may be just as stressed as you. Before you leave your house, take time to center; ask for the grace to be a channel of God's peace and joy to whomever you encounter.

Get-togethers: Around the table or sending a Christmas card, share when you experience the presence and care of God.

A Blue Christmas: Richard Rohr reflected, "We all need to feel and know... that we are not the first ones who have suffered, nor will we be the last. We are all partners with both the living and the dead...longing for healing." Practice solidarity. Be on the lookout for how you might be a help to another.

Social Justice News


Please consider donating a Christmas basket for a family in need.

Our December Blue Bag collection will in the form of Christmas meals provided to SWEM. The Christmas baskets are designed for families of 3 & 4 people, and for each basket, please provide the following:

- Fruit cocktail or canned fruit
- Soup (large can) *Fruit juice *Instant mashed potatoes
- Large can of sweet potatoes (15oz), *2 canned vegetables
- Cranberry sauce, Can gravy, *Bag or box of stuffing (12oz)
- Dessert (Jell-o, or pudding, or cake mix/ frosting, or pie crust/ & filling)

The baskets will be collected at St. Monica's Dec. 13 & 14 a half hour before the 4pm and 10:15am Masses at the detached garage. Enter from Monica Street and the garage will be on your left. If you are able, a box will be available for submitting \$10 cash or a check written out to SWEM per basket to cover additional expenses.
