

### Creation Corner

This past Wednesday was the eighth anniversary of the publication of *Laudato Si'*. We thank Don Cudzillo for giving us the summaries from the encyclical, reminding us of the powerful message the Pope has given all of us to care for our home.

#### Chapter 3: The Human Roots of the Ecological Crisis

In chapter three of the encyclical *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis shares perspective on some of the motivating factors that have brought us to the current state of our global challenges. He agrees that the progression of science and technology over the past several centuries has brought several wonderful benefits to humanity. These "products of a God-given human creativity" has allowed a "modification of nature for useful purposes". However, we have sometimes misinterpreted our dominion over nature because of overlooking the reality of our responsibility as caretakers of God's creation. The world is not just to serve our immediate needs; it must be nurtured and cultivated in a way that respects the interrelationships inherent in our environments, resources, and societies. We

can gain a better understanding of our true stewardship role by using wisdom gained from ethical, philosophical, and spiritual insights. This will lead to a "more sound and fruitful development of individuals and society" as



well as a path to a more balanced ecology.

**G&G Steakout II** at 810 Genesee St., is directly across from our church. Owners Rick & Bernie Gause, family members & partners, are buying and completely renovating the former

store. The Gauses are legendary in Rochester, as evidenced by the traffic jam whenever they set up their outdoor kitchen. The



original G&G Steakout opened 40 years ago and became very popular, with various locations on Genesee Street, Jefferson Avenue, and North Street. Family members reunited to open a concession stand at the 2022 Summer Soul Music Festival at Frontier Field. It was such a success that they decided to re-open a storefront. 810 Genesee St. is a perfect match for their business.

G&G is famous for its signature "steak & cheese" sandwich, made with chopped steak, onions, lettuce, tomato, and melted cheese on a large bun. It also offers burgers, wings, and fries. They will be cooking outside on Thursday-Saturday until the building is ready. Attendees of our Saturday 4pm Mass may easily take dinner home. Incidentally, Rick Gause is well-known as a football coach at various local high schools - most notably at BK. We are fortunate to have them as neighbors!
