

Creation Corner

A Palm Sunday Message from Mother Earth

My Dear People,

You might say for as long as I've been around, I've been God's storyteller, revealing how the Divine moves through death into new life. Asteroids, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, changes in the makeup of the atmosphere, land masses, sea levels, climate, life forms, even mass extinctions.

I have survived - and thrived - in surprising ways.

I'm destined to survive for at least another 7 billion years. I'm not the one who needs saving. It's you I'm worried about.

The environment that's been a home for you, shaped and crafted over so many eons to suit you perfectly - it's on the verge of a change that could spiral into catastrophic consequences leading to immense human suffering.

And this time the change is happening sooo fast- there's little I can do to ameliorate it without your help.

What we could do together if our relationship were different!

I have so much I could still teach you if only you thought I was wise enough to listen to.

I am being critical of the mess you've made but I'm not blaming you - that's not my way, or our Creator's either.

All creation has been loved into and for Sacred Being. You are part of a family of relationships. And you have a special gift to offer - the gift of responsibility. You can choose what your response will be in the face of this crisis.

So, as you reflect and pray this Holy Week, consider your gift of responsibility and the choices you make, and take courage and hope from the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of your beloved Jesus.

Early Voting Changes for March!

Legislation passed (A.7690/S.7550) and signed by the Governor last September (Chapter 474 of the Laws of 2023) changes the early voting period for the 2024 Presidential primary. Early voting for the upcoming Presidential primary election will take place between Saturday, March 23, 2024, and Saturday, March 30, 2024. There will be no Early Voting on Sunday, March 31, 2024.

For the Presidential primary, early voting poll sites will now be open for at least 9 hours on each of the 8 days. Please visit your county board of elections website for more information on early voting locations and hours.
